We are delighted to invite you to **submit special issues to *Swiss Psychology Open***. *Swiss Psychology Open* is a multidisciplinary, open-access, peer-reviewed journal that publishes high-quality research on all aspects of psychology. It is committed to publishing research that is rigorous, innovative, and relevant to a broad audience. *Swiss Psychology Open* publishes original research articles, reviews, meta-analyses, and methodological papers that contribute to advancing the field of psychology. The journal has a fast turnaround time and offers authors the opportunity to publish their work quickly and efficiently, all whilst ensuring quality and rigor.

With the present call, we encourage researchers to submit their special issue proposal to *Swiss Psychology Open* and contribute to the advancement of psychology research. Our editorial team is committed to working closely with you to ensure the success of your special issue and can assist you with identifying potential reviewers. We currently welcome special issues that cover a wide range of topics, including but not limited to social psychology, clinical psychology, cognitive psychology, developmental psychology, and neuropsychology.

Each special issue should feature between **6 to 12 articles**. Although theoretical contributions are allowed, the majority of all contributions to each special issue should be of empirical nature. The publication fee for accepted articles is CHF 500.- (Note, however, that fees can always be waived if the authors do not have funding for open access fees.)

We also encourage postdocs and early career researchers to submit special issues as a unique opportunity to gain first-hand experience working as an editor. As an editor, you will be coordinating the review process and ultimately ensure that the manuscripts meet the journal's standards as well as the open science policies it adheres to. This experience will be enriching in further developing your academic skills and scientific expertise, both as a researcher and editor.
